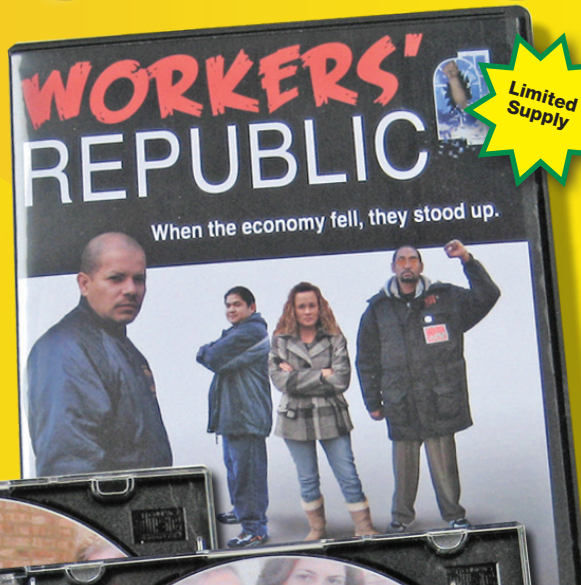


Spring Fundraising Offer
