For the most part, the American culture has been comfortable with freezing Dr. King's image at the point in 1963 when he gave his "I Have A Dream" speech - feeling safe in the assumption that various forms of token integration were King's only objectives. However, this forum will explore the more radical ideas Dr. King put forward during his final years (1965 through 1968). Many are unaware of King's later-life political evolution because the media failed to fully inform the public. This forum will also examine what impact these continuing policies of media bias have had on the current state of U.S. foreign and domestic affairs.
